³ Courses used to fulfill History Core Degree Requirements may not also be used to fulfill Pathways requirements. No more than 6 hours of 1000 level or 2000 level history courses may count towards History Core Degree Requirements. Students interested in Social Studies Licensure should take any combination of HIST 1115, 1116 and HIST 1215, 1216 (all required courses) to prepare.

Foreign Language: The minimum requirement may be met in high school by completing 3 units of a single foreign or classical language credit or American Sign Language credit. The

requirement may also be met by one of the following before or after transfer admission:

- Those who have taken 2 years of a single foreign language in high school can complete the 1106 equivalent course at their current college in the same language as taken in high school or by taking the 1106 course at Virginia Tech.
- Students who have not completed two units of a single foreign language in high school **MUST** earn six semester hours of college-level foreign or classical language credit (ex: 1105-1106). These six hours are in addition to the 120 hours required for graduation.
