Footnotes

¹ Spanish courses as appropriate depending on high school Spanish background, or Pathways courses as needed. The VT equivalents to SPAN 101, 102, 201 or 202 at the VCCS cannot be used to fulfill the Spanish major requirements of 33 hours at the 3000-level and above which must be completed at Virginia Tech. However, if a student takes SPAN 101, 102, 201 or 202 and wishes to transfer those courses, the credit will be counted towards the free electives for the overall degree program.

Students who have not completed two units of a single foreign language in high school MUST earn six semester hours of college-level foreign or classical language credit (ex: 1105-1106 or 1114). These six hours are in addition to the 120 hours required for graduation.
