The VT equivalents to RUS 101 or 102 at the VCCS cannot be used to fulfill the Russian major requirements of 33 hours at the 2000-level and above. All 3000-level courses must be completed at Virginia Tech. However, if a student takes RUS 101 or 102 and wishes to transfer those courses, the credit will be counted towards the free electives for the overall degree program.

Students who have not completed two units of a single foreign language in high school **MUST** earn six semester hours of college-level foreign or classical language credit (ex: 1105-1106 or 1114). These six hours are in addition to the 120 hours required for graduation.
